It all starts on January 13 at 10:00 am at the precinct caucuses for all Republicans in Franklin County. At the caucuses we will elect delegates to the county convention, where we will elect delegates to the state convention, where we will ultimately elect delegates to the national convention. This is your chance to either be a delegate or elect the delegates from our state. Please come and have your voice heard.

Franklin County Republican Caucus FAQs

What is a Republican precinct caucus?

The precinct caucus is the first step in selecting the Republican presidential candidate. The caucus is the first step in electing the delegates who will eventually go to the Republican National Convention to nominate the Republican presidential candidate.

Why should I attend the caucus?

This is your opportunity to participate in selecting the next Republican presidential candidate. Each precinct will elect at least one delegate to attend the County Convention. You could be that delegate and could even end up as a delegate to the National Convention if you can convince others you should be the one to represent them. It all starts at the precinct caucus.

Where is my caucus being held?

Franklin county caucuses are being held in three locations, depending on your precinct.

- Precincts 1 through 78 and 98 through 123 will meet at McLoughlin Middle School in Pasco
- Precincts 79 through 88 will meet at Basin City Elementary School in Basin City
- Precincts 89 through 97 will meet at Connell Elementary School in Connell

What do I need to do to attend my caucus?

You should first confirm you are a registered voter and which precinct you are in. This can be done by checking on voter.votewa.gov. Your registration status and precinct number can be found under the Voter Registration tab on the website.

Next show up at the right location at the right time and register to participate. As part of the registration, you will need to sign a form that you are a Republican and that you will not be participating in another party's 2024 caucus and/or conventions.

When is my precinct caucus?

All Republican precinct caucuses in Washington State will be held on January 13, 2024, at 10:00 am. This time is set by the Washington State Republican Party. Registration will start at 9:30 since it will take time to register all participants.

How long will the caucus last?

Most caucuses should be done within an hour. There will be some business at the beginning. Then precincts will meet together to vote. Larger precincts will take longer since they are electing more delegates and alternates. These precincts may be there longer, but most precincts will be done in less than an hour.

Can I be a delegate?

Any registered voter can be elected as a delegate to represent their precinct at the County Convention. There may be others who want to be a delegate as well so you will have to convince the majority of your precinct to elect you. You can also attend the County Convention as an alternate. There can be as many elected alternates as there are elected delegates. Precinct committee officers are automatic delegates to the County Convention.

What happens after the caucus?

The next step in the presidential candidate selection process is the County Convention. All elected precinct caucus delegates and alternates will be invited to attend the County Convention to be held on February 24 or March 2 (depending on venue availability). At the County Convention, 27 delegates and 27 alternates will be elected to attend the State Convention in Spokane on April 19-20. At the State Convention, delegates and alternates will be elected to attend the National Convention in Milwaukee, WI in July.
